ONE-PARAGRAPH VERDICT

Both recruits land at MIR 78 — Tier B. Same composite, two completely different basketball profiles. Patterson is the physical anchor (rebounding, durability, defense). Cole is the offensive engine (scoring, tempo, ball security). **The choice is system-driven.**

Where Each Player Wins

PATTERSON WINS: REBOUND (+14) · DURABILITY (+12) · DEFENSE (+8)

Patterson is the physical anchor profile. He grades top-quartile in three components that show up most in March basketball: rebounding, durability, defense. The kind of player who lifts your floor and doesn't miss games. Will not shrink in the moment.

COLE WINS: TEMPO (+13) · IMPACT (+9) · BALL SECURITY (+7)

Cole is the playmaking-and-pace profile. He pushes the floor, connects the offense, and takes care of the ball. Lower durability is a concern — investigate it during recruitment. But the offensive upside is real.

Pace Context

Cole plays at 73.2 possessions per 40 (top-20 nationally). Patterson plays at 66.8 possessions per 40 (bottom-third).

This matters. Cole's scoring numbers are partially pace-inflated. Patterson's defensive rebound numbers may translate even better if he moves to a higher-pace system.
