**Tier B wing forward with high-major upside.** Strong rebounding profile, plus durability, and an emerging defensive game. Scoring profile is rotational — he'll fit best as a 3-and-D wing in a defined role rather than a featured scorer. Clutch component (80) suggests he won't shrink in key moments. Best fit: power-conference roster with established offensive hierarchy where his rebounding and defense earn him 22-28 minutes per game.

## Strengths · Risks · Fit Notes

### STRENGTHS

**Rebound (82):** Strong defensive rebounding profile for his position. Top 25% of wings nationally.

**Durability (85):** Has missed only 2 games in his career. High games-available rate, low foul-out frequency.

**Clutch (80):** In close games (within 5 in the last 5 minutes), his usage is up and his eFG% holds steady. Won't shrink.

### RISKS

**Ball Security (71):** Below-average ball security profile. Assist-to-turnover ratio is 1.3 — fine for a wing but suggests he shouldn't be handling the ball in late-game high-pressure situations.

**Impact (72):** Modest secondary creation. He's a finisher, not a creator. Best as a complementary scorer.

### FIT NOTES

Ideal landing spot: A power-conference program with an established lead guard and primary scorer, looking for a defense-and-rebounding wing to fill the 3-position rotation. Programs that emphasize toughness, rebounding, and defensive identity will value Mitchell highly. Programs looking for a featured scorer should look elsewhere.

*"Mitchell is a high-floor / moderate-ceiling transfer. He's not the swing piece that wins you a Sweet 16 by himself. But he's the kind of player who lifts your floor by three games in the win column. If you have a star scorer and a lead guard, and what you need is a tough, reliable wing who rebounds and defends and won't miss games — Mitchell is your guy. The risk profile is low. The durability and Clutch components alone make him a worthy mid-tier portal target. Recommend offer at second-tier portal pricing."*

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
